# **INTRODUCTION TO THE MAJOR**

The Department of Music grants a B.A. degree in **Music** and also a minor in Music. The department is dedicated to a holistic liberal education in the arts and humanities and thus involves students in all aspects of the study of music: theoretical and creative studies, historical and cultural studies, music and technology, and performance.

The Music major may serve as pre-professional training for the student seeking a career in music or provide a lasting source of enrichment for the student with other career goals. A performance audition is not required to declare the major.

## **CAPSTONE AND HONORS**

A capstone project, taken concurrently with one additional course, concludes the major during senior year. Capstone projects may include performance recitals, music compositions, scholarly papers, or digital creations, among others.


